

Questions for Reflection – Colossians 3:12-17, Forgiveness

1. Can we separate vertical forgiveness from God from horizontal forgiveness between one another? Why or why not?
2. How does God's forgiveness change us so that we are able to journey toward forgiving others?
3. What broken relationship have you experienced? Why is it so hard to confess wrongdoing and accept forgiveness?
4. How do we "bear with one another" or forgive when we honestly don't perceive a situation the same way?

From the AMC Peace Committee: Dr. Katharine Hayhoe says, "Having a real discussion (about climate change) is to connect over shared values like family, community and religion." Hayhoe is the climate ambassador for the

World Evangelical Alliance, an atmospheric scientist and an evangelical Christian. She was born in Canada, earned a BS in physics and Astronomy at the University of Toronto and PhD in Atmospheric Science at the University of Illinois at Urbana. She is now a professor of Atmospheric Science and Political Science at Texas Tech University. Hayhoe co-authored the book, *A Climate for Change: Global Warming Facts for Faith-Based Decisions*. She is known for her outreach efforts to Christian communities and has been very effective as she delivers lectures that are rooted in scripture and focus on the benefits of collective action to mitigate the effects of climate change. Please join us to hear her TED Talk on this subject and for a continued discussion about this topic on **Sunday evening, October 17 at 7 pm**.
