

During this time of Lent *broken twigs* have been placed on the communion table. These twigs represent the dryness, brokenness, and hopelessness that can distance us from our relationship with our Lord. But Lent is not the end of the story during this Season. After Christ's death his resurrection embodies the hope, joy, release and rebirth we experience at Easter. *Birds* symbolize this cycle as they build their nests. They gather the dry, broken twigs and build a nest that will bring new life.
