Four resolutions will be considered: (1) Clarity of MC-USA Polity and the Role of Membership Guidelines (2) Repentance and Transformation relating to the LGBTQIA community (subject first to a vote on whether it will be considered) (3) MC-USA Accessibility and (4) MC-USA for Justice (to be studied, but not voted on).
