We thank you, God for times of celebration with family and friends. Bless Erin and Dylan as they begin their marriage.

"God, grant that we may pass through the coming year with faithful hearts. There will be much to test us and make weak our strength before the year ends. In our confusion we shall often say the word that is not true and do the thing of which we are ashamed. There will be errors in the mind and great inaccuracies of judgment. In seeking the light, we shall again and again find ourselves walking in the darkness. We shall mistake our light for Your light and we shall drink from the responsibility of the choice we make...

We'll hear the familiar Biblical story once again and then we'll hear a contemporary story, a children's book, with a message for all of us. And we'll add some singing to accompany the storytelling.

Luke 2:1-7 – In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.
