

Questions for Reflection – 2 Kings 6:8-23

- 1. Have you ever had a meal with people you considered enemies, or people with whom you had strong differences? How did you feel? How did that meal come about? Did the nature of your relationship with those people change after you ate with them?
- 2. Describe a current situation that weighs heavily on your heart where peace seems impossible. What might it look like for God to transform this situation?
