Litany for September 10, 2023 – Education Sunday

Leader: God sent Jesus into the world to show us how to live as God's people.

Children: Who will tell us about Jesus?

Teachers | Parents: We will tell you about Jesus! We want to share the stories of Jesus with you, so that as we worship, pray and learn about Jesus you might be inspired to love him and live like him!

All: As we hear and share God's story together, may our hearts be opened to love Jesus.

Leader: We are all created, known, and loved by God, and each person's faith journey is unique. The Bible offers guidance for this journey, revealing God's work in the world and how to be part of the ongoing story of the people of God.

Aileen: Our denomination has recently released a new Storybook Bible called *The Peace Table.* Many people in our church gave money so that each family with young children could have a copy of this beautiful new Bible in their home – it's for the whole family to share and read together!

Bonnie: It tells about the creation of the earth – the seas, the land, plants, animals and people. It gives rules for living at peace with God and each other. This Bible doesn't just have stories and rules. It has songs that express many feelings – sadness, anger, doubt, fear and joy. It even has a love song! Much of this storybook Bible is about Jesus, who was sent by God into the world. Jesus healed people. He taught and told many stories. He even did amazing miracles!

Janine: When our students become first graders, we present this Bible to them so that they have a Bible of their very own. It's called the *Adventure Bible* and it's designed for children, to help them learn how to read and use the Bible in their daily lives. We have two first graders this year – Lillian Voth and Ellie Unrau. This Bible also teaches about the 10 Commandments – the rules God gave people for how to live together peacefully. It shows you some verses to read when you feel a certain way... like worried, sad, angry or lonely. It also has a part that tells you about love – God's love for us, and how God wants us to love other people. It tells you things that Jesus taught about and where to read about them. And it even has a list of famous children in the Bible! This Bible also has a timeline of Jesus' life, and where to read about each event. We hope and pray that this Bible will help you to spend time reading and learning about Jesus.

Teachers | Parents: As we teach and guide our children in their faith formation we will study God's Word together and talk about how it connects to our lives.

All: We thank God for those who teach! We will pray for our teachers and parents as they prepare lessons, nurture relationships and open their hearts to the wisdom of God's Spirit.
