Morning Prayer

O God, we join the psalmists, declaring your praises and our gratitude. We ask for your forgiveness when our response to you is lacking in trust, or awareness, or action; guide our thoughts, our words and our choices so that our lives reflect your love and hope.

We thank you for the fun and fellowship that the High school students had last week as they gathered at Tina and Ben's house and we thank you for the opportunity that the community Jr Hi students have to gather this evening. We thank you God for Pasto Tim and the wisdom and challenges he has brought to us these last weeks in worship. We confess, God, that even as we enjoy relative freedom and peace in our daily lives, we are in the minority alongside of the rest of the world. We pray for those in the midst of horror in Gaza, on the West Bank and in Israel. O Lord, have mercy. May your children in those lands who are all descendants of Abraham somehow remember that they are all your children and they all need a home where they can live and move and have their being in you, their Creator. We pray for those in Ukraine for whom war in their country continues. We pray for others around the world who cannot live in peace under their own vine or fig tree.

You are the God of justice who sent Jesus, the messenger of peace; may your people have strong voices and courageous spirits to live out your call in this world. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Scripture - 2 Samuel 5:1-5 NIV

5 All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron and said, "We are your own flesh and blood. ² In the past, while Saul was king over us, you were the one who led Israel on their military campaigns. And the LORD said to you, 'You will shepherd my people Israel, and you will become their ruler.'"

³ When all the elders of Israel had come to King David at Hebron, the king made a covenant with them at Hebron before the LORD, and they anointed David king over Israel.

⁴ David was thirty years old when he became king, and he reigned forty years. ⁵ In Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months, and in Jerusalem he reigned over all Israel and Judah thirty-three years.
