

Exploring The Immigration System

The Peace Team will lead four Sunday afternoon sessions beginning on March $3^{\rm rd}$ in which we will explore and discuss various aspects of immigration and migration. The format of the first three sessions will be to view two 10 to 15-minute videos, each followed by an open discussion. The legal, human, and structural challenges of our national immigration system are complex and frustrating. This series is an attempt to more fully understand what is really happening, in hopes that our attitudes and actions will be most appropriate. Each session will be from 4:00-5:30 pm with faspa.

On March 6th, the Elem., JH, and HS Midweek classes will be working on several joint service projects, one of which is making care packages for our college students as they prepare for finals season.
