Good morning! And welcome to this time of worship at AMC.

Like many other traditions, the Service of Lessons and Carols was started by something that was happening outside of The Church that was then adapted and invited into The Church. In England, in the late 18th century, people often went caroling from house to house, sometimes singing Christmas carols but often singing what would have been viewed as more "contemporary pop" songs. There was much jocularity, raucousness and consumption of alcohol with the carolers often ending up in the pubs.

So, rather than just scolding people, a certain pastor, a Bishop, actually, named Edward White Benson, wanted to give folks an alternative activity. So, in the hopes of inviting folks into the church for a worship service, he came up with a service of 9 Biblical lessons that told wide arc of the story – from creation, through the prophets and to the Gospels, telling about the coming Messiah, adding hymns and songs to go along with each reading. This service became known as the Service of Lessons and Carols and is still done and offered broadly throughout all denominations. Originally, it was done as a late-night service on Christmas Eve or another late night in the season when people were partying.

Many thanks to Renae for, again, putting this service together – she had the lovely idea of using the Peace Table, Storybook Bible for our readings this year.

May this morning-time service be a thoughtful balm for your soul and a reminder of God's creative, loving plan of salvation for humans and all of creation.
