Words of Introduction -

When I wondered aloud to Renae a couple months ago, whether the Chancel Choir might be able to sing several Easter anthems, or maybe even do a "Lessons and Carols for Easter" kind of service, I had no idea what kind of creativity would spring from her!

The past year of celebrating 150 years since many of our forebears migrated here still held some energy and inspiration for her! That, added to the 500th year of the birth of Anabaptism led to her wondering what kinds of Easter songs might be available to us as we look back in time.

The initial anthem, *Hear the News This Easter Morn* is a contemporary call to listen to the story, hear the news.

After that invitation, we'll go as far back as we could go; we do have sources of texts and tunes in our hymnal that date back to the 5^{th} and 6^{th} centuries. The plainsong chant is representative of

the early church, although after Constantine. We'll hear Luke 24, verses 1-5 read in Greek by Peter Buller.

Then we'll continue to move through the centuries in various parts of Europe and the U.S. that follow the Anabaptist movement with songs of Easter praise!

Sometimes the connection is simply the time period like, connecting the King James Version of the Bible with the composer Billings. Sometimes there's a connection to location... when the Anabaptists were in the Netherlands, Prussia and here.

May the variety of languages, translations, song texts and music bring to mind the many ways that people have retold the Resurrection story through 2000 years of history.
