Goessel Ministerial Alliance Joint Worship Service: The GMA will offer a joint worship service for the three area churches. This idea was inspired by the joint service that we did last year in celebration of the 150th year marking our forebears' immigration. That service was widely appreciated! We also felt it was time to make a change from the Thanksgiving meal followed closely by the Christmas Brass Concert. We will continue to host the Christmas Brass, but let go of the Community Thanksgiving meal. We feel that it's beneficial for our congregations to worship together at least one time per year! This year the worship service will be held on August 3 at 10am at the Goessel City Park and it will be hosted by the Goessel Church. This service will be led by the pastors who are part of the Goessel Ministerial Alliance, with Pastor Brad Penner preaching this year. (This joint service is tentatively scheduled to be held at the Tabor Mennonite Church Park in 2026 and the Alexanderwohl Mennonite Church campus in 2027.)
