Mennonite Action is a movement of Mennonites, Christians, and friends following in the example of Jesus Christ, who called us to live as active peacemakers, standing firmly on the side of the downtrodden and the oppressed. Right now the genocide in Gaza rages on while the authoritarian powers of our government kidnap our neighbors off the streets in the U.S. Many of us are horrified and want to do something, but we don't know how. Mennonite Action is bringing training, tools, and frameworks to help our communities respond with courage in this historical moment, "discerning the times" as we're called to do. The events will include trainings on noncooperation, grassroots organizing, and mutual aid. In addition to spending time worshiping in prayer and song, we'll enjoy a meal together too.
